O SOLARWORLD

Altus Sport was invited by Streetfootballworld to identify two areas where SolarWorld could install solar stations with a big TV screen for poor communities without power to watch the Soccer World Cup. Kliptown in Soweto and Kildare in Mpumalanga were identified and SolarWorld installed the stations with a 5 year contract to maintain the stations. The communities were in the clouds and could watch the matches with full houses throughout.
