People are encouraged to get active, learn about the history and values and try new sport & activities.

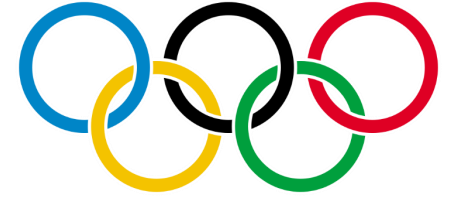
1st Olympic Day held on 23 June 1948.

2024 slogan: Let's move!!

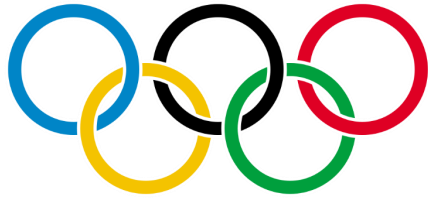


Country parade always led by Greece, where the Olympic Games originated.

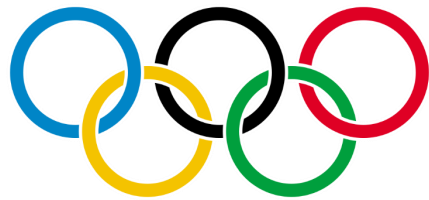

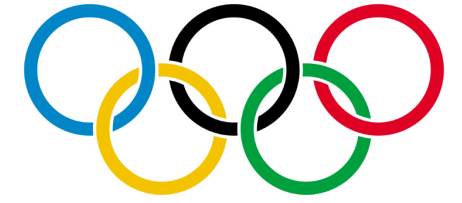
As at the Olympic Games the Head of State declares the Games open.
