To celebrate National Recreation Day and International Peace Day through togetherness in sport.

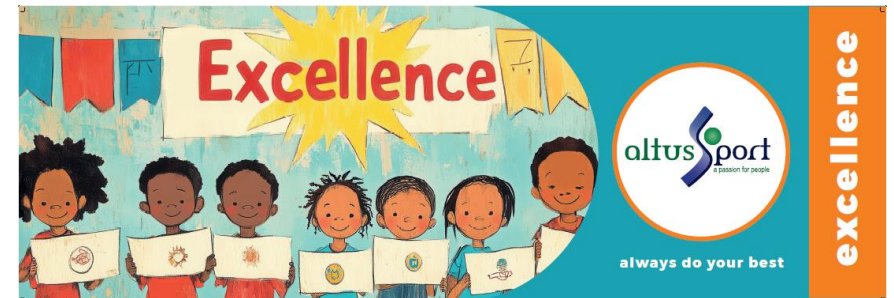
We aim to:

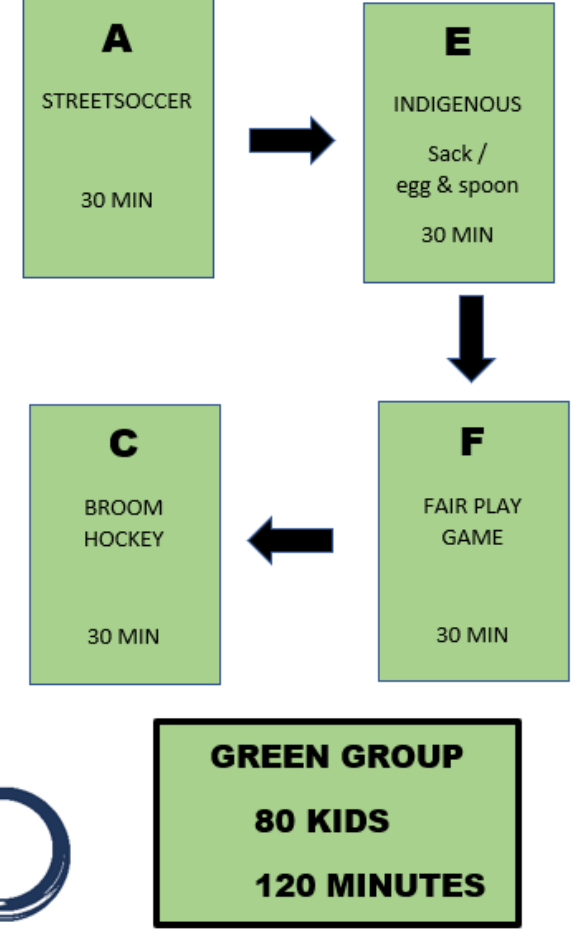
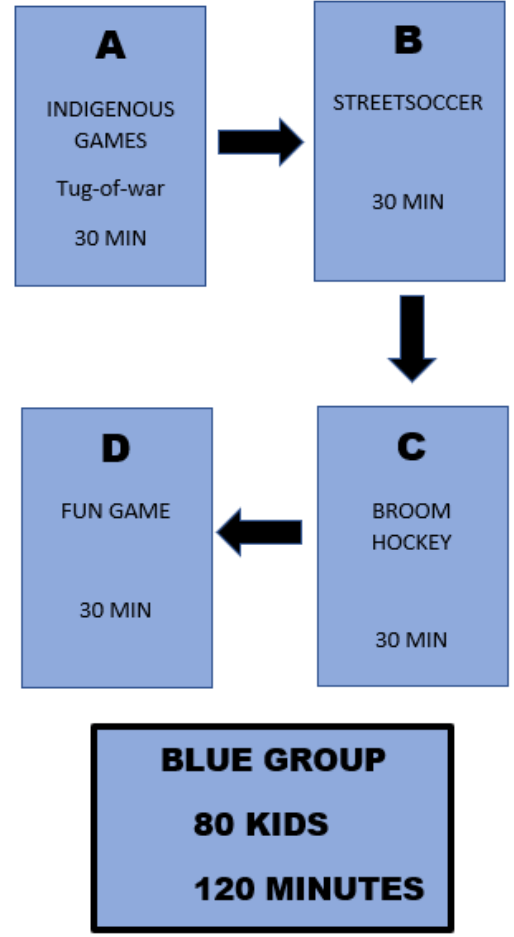

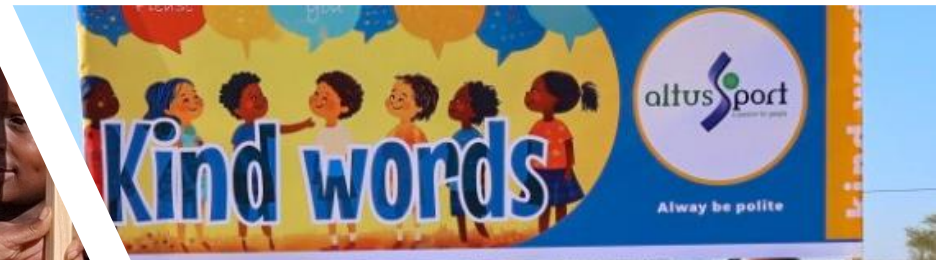
